DIRECTOR OF TEACHING AND LEARNING

As the Higher School Certificate concludes this week, I think the 2020 Year 12 students would join me in thanking the whole school community for the prayers and support shown to them during what can only be described as an extraordinary year. The calm way in which the students have completed each of their exams is testament to their own preparation and the efforts of the Presiding Officer, Mrs Christine O'Grady, and her team of invigilators. I extend our thanks to them for their care and support of our HSC students.

The 2021 Year 12 class has commenced their Higher School Certificate program of study. Students completing the accelerated Studies of Religion 1-unit course have already experienced a taste of Higher School Certificate, and I hope they are able to make the most of this as they engage in the remainder of their Higher School Certificate program. I spoke at the 2021 Year 12 student assembly this morning reinforcing the importance of making the most of all learning opportunities at school. This includes authentic use of timetabled study periods and flexible learning time. Review of this year's HSC examinations highlights the importance of a comprehensive understanding of Year 11 content. Many students believe that the Higher School Certificate pertains just to Year 12 knowledge and skills, but this is not true. The skills and deeper understanding achieved in prior courses is accessed in Year 12 courses and supports students as they develop an understanding of new content. 2021 Year 12 students are encouraged to draw on this prior knowledge as part of their study program.

Many Year 7-10 students are currently completing take home and in class assessments. As results are made available to students and their parents, I encourage each student to take this opportunity to reflect on his application in class, engagement with content, and preparation through study and homework. 2020 has not provided all students with the easiest learning pathway, and we recognise that some boys are

challenged with their general organisation and management of homework and assessment. These challenges will be addressed with students early in 2021, to ensure that they are prepared to maximise all learning opportunities.
