TEACHING AND LEARNING

Year 8 and 9 students are in the final stages of their 2023 subject selection process. I would like to thank Mr Waller, Mr Endacott, Mr Newton, Mrs Kibby and Mr Murray for their face to face and digital presentations providing outlines of the different elective subjects being offered at St Paul's in 2023. Subject preferences are due this Friday, 26th August.

The Trial Examination Period for Year 12 has concluded. This is the final school-based assessment for Year 12 students, and their first assessment period in the style of HSC examinations. Given the lack of experience with formal examination blocks, students generally engaged in their examinations with a positive attitude. It is critical that they now respond appropriately to teacher feedback and recommendations to set themselves up for success. All students should now be looking forward to the upcoming HSC examinations and making the most of the time available to prepare effectively for their scheduled examinations. HSC examinations will commence on Wednesday 12th October and conclude on Friday 4th November.

Year 11 students will be sitting their End of Preliminary examinations from Thursday 15th September until Friday 23rd September. This examination period not only allows them to

demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of the courses studied this year, but it also replicates the formal examination blocks they will have in their HSC year, providing them with some insight into what is required of them to be successful in their Year 12 Trial and HSC examinations. I encourage each student in Year 11 to begin to develop a study program that will not only support them as they prepare for their upcoming examinations, but also set them in good stead for their HSC year.

Given that the focus of this newsletter article is about preparation for and execution of formal examinations I would encourage all students in Years 7 – 10 to consider how they apply themselves to the demands of their secondary education. It is important to understand that being successful generally requires effort outside of school hours. This includes not just completing set tasks in the form of homework and/or assessment tasks, but also revision and study. Developing this capability early equips a student to successfully navigate the learning progressions that they engage with throughout their schooling.

MATHEMATICS

Year 7 have finished decimals and fractions moving onto algebra, which is the lynchpin of High School mathematics.

Year 8 are revisiting Algebra from Year 7 but extending their skills to solving algebraic equations.

Year 9 are exploring similarity in geometry, which has applications in the real world (maps, building plans.)

Year 10 are revising right angle Trigonometry from Year 9, moving onto non-right-angle trigonometry.

Year 11 Advanced and Extension 1 are on target to finish the Preliminary courses in readiness of the End of Preliminary Exams during weeks 9 and 10.

Year 12 have sat their first 3-hour trial exams. We have 58 days to prepare for their HSC, this will involve days during the next term break to sit past HSC papers as well as daily sitting past HSC multiple choice papers.

PDHPE

Year 7

Year 7 students are undertaking the opportunity to extend their understanding of personal challenges and how to seek help for such issues. This is accompanied through the integration of their new area of study, named "We Are All in This Together". Students will also be undergoing the learning topic of "Being Health Savvy" where they are challenged to analyse and suggest ways in which health services on the Northern Beaches would better suit teenagers in our peninsula.





Year 8

Year 8 PDHPE students continue their unit of study "Rights and Responsibilities" into Term 3, in preparation for their learning task. This unit continues to explore promoting equality, recognising inequality in relationships as well as strategies to promote healthy relationships.

The practical component of the students' involvement in PDHPE this Term is the learning unit "On the Ball". This unit focuses on the Development of ball games enhancing skills and allowing inclusive participation.





Year 9

Year 9 PDHPE students will be covering content in the unit of study "Help and Support". Within this unit students will be challenged to understand conflict in relationships, how to recognise unhealthy relationships and how to seek and offer help. Skills developed in this unit of study include self-awareness, inclusivity and sociocultural differences.



Stage 5 PASS

Students undergoing the unit of study "Advanced skills of Floorball", have now mastered their practical skills involved in the modified version of field hockey. The second half of Term 3 turns focus to their new area of study "Technology in Sport", aiming to develop students' knowledge and understanding of how technological developments are used in sport, and the current impact and future implications of technological developments on sport and the sport performer.

Year 10

Year 10 PDHPE students will cover the learning topic of "Turning Knowledge into Action" during Term 3. This unit of study involves taking a mature approach to understanding the reasons for barriers faced by a marginalised group in Australia. Students aim to understand why marginalisation of these people has happened and what is being done to reduce and stop it.



Year 11

Year 11 PDHPE students have been thoroughly enjoying their new area of study "Fitness Choices". This module examines the exercise options that are available to meet the varying fitness needs of individuals. Students investigate what exercise means to different people and the factors that influence exercise choices. As the Term nears an end the cohort are preparing for their End of Year Exams, which also marks their final assessment for the year as a Year 11 student.

Year 12

Year 12 students have now completed their PDHPE Trial HSC Exam. It is now crunch time where they will have their heads in their books, revising, resynthesizing, and rehearsing what they have learnt in the last two years in PDHPE in preparation to put their hard work on show in the final HSC Exam on November 2nd.
