September is Safeguarding Month in the Diocese of Broken Bay, both in our parishes, and in our school and colleges. It is an opportunity to highlight the importance of safeguarding and encourage everyone to consider their shared responsibility to keep children and young people safe. It is also a time to acknowledge with sorrow the failures of our past - the betrayal of trust and harm that has been inflicted on young people and vulnerable adults by those who should have protected and cared for them.

As a College, this is a part of our history that many would rather not speak about, but which we must acknowledge, for it was silence, discomfort and disbelief that exacerbated the harm caused to many victims of abuse and their families.

To begin this month Bishop Anthony led the Church of Broken Bay in a Liturgy of Lament at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara at which we repented the past, prayed for healing and committed ourselves to doing all that we can to keep young people and vulnerable adults in our parishes, schools and colleges safe into the future.

During this liturgy the words of Br Michael Herry's Hymn of Healing for the Church stood out as a clear expression of the prayer that we offer for the future.

*Stir in us a deep compassion, firm resolve to heal the past.
Help us understand the darkness, lest again it comes to pass.
Lord we pray for those so wounded, hear the cry of victims' pain.
Help us seek the path of justice. Help us see the light again.*


In the workshop we have Ukuleles and contemporary furniture underway. The boys are working with precision and extending the skills they have gained earlier in the year.

Year 7 have been conducting risk assessments to understand the precautionary measures that are necessary when using different chemicals such as acids.




Year 7 students have also been modelling convection currents that occur in the Earth's mantle, deep beneath our feet.

YEAR 7 WELLBEING

On Wednesday 24 August, Year 7 were privileged to meet Narada and David from The Man Cave who facilitated workshops on redefining the journey to manhood. The Man Cave is a not-for-profit organisation that recognises the importance of positive role models and sets out to teach skills needed to thrive as boys roll on through their teenage years into manhood.

During these workshops, students explored several issues which are prevalent amongst teenagers, particularly in their early years of high school. One thing that really resonated with the students was the analogy of a glass jar used to describe the pressures we face in everyday life and the impacts that these have on us as they continue to accumulate over time. Students were given an opportunity to voice some of the “rocks” or pressures placed in their glass jars which weigh them down such as schoolwork, high expectations, friendships, and familial relationships. This provided an entry point to discuss ways in which we can recognise when our glass jars cannot take any more weight, and what this looks like when the jar eventually “shatters”. The students were very forthcoming with strategies they can use to get support, emphasising the core message that a problem shared is a problem halved.



Overall, I think the day was a success and laid the groundwork for meaningful conversations around these issues moving forward. Many students showed great courage in voicing some of their own struggles or barriers which prevent them from being themselves, or actively engaging with school. The feedback from students was positive and repeatedly acknowledged that they learned new things about their peers, underlining the importance of empathy.

As a Year 7 community, we will continue our discussion of the issues and messages raised in The Man Cave. We will continue to encourage students to talk about their worries and concerns, ultimately lightening their load. Please know that there is always support for students who have or are experiencing any of the above concerns. If you would like to discuss this further, please reach out.


