TEACHING AND LEARNING

Last week Year 11 students and their parents attended the 2023 HSC Information Evening. This presentation is a NESA requirement ensuring that all students are cognisant of their responsibilities to successfully complete their final year of school. The take home message for students was that while application and commitment in Years 10 and 11 help students prepare for their final year of school, it is what happens from now that will have the greatest impact on a student's success over the next twelve months.

Irrespective of a student's HSC pathway, it is important that he applies himself to his assessment and study to the best of his ability. While the assessment program provides the opportunity for students to set their rankings in each of the courses they are studying, it is important to consider that students working hard together as a group from the very beginning of their course is more likely to achieve a common goal of higher results as they support, challenge, and inspire each other. It is this collaborative practice that we encourage in all students at St Paul's.

End of Preliminary Reports will be available to Year 11 students this Friday. It is important that all Year 11 students reflect on the feedback provided in these reports as they make decisions for their patterns of study for their HSC year.

Year 12 are now into their second week of HSC examinations. There is a positive atmosphere among the HSC students and given that they have had three years of interrupted learning, their commitment to their final examinations is encouraging. We wish them success in their remaining examinations.

This Term is a busy one for all members of the St Paul's community. It is important that all students are on task in their studies and make the most of the opportunities to demonstrate improved knowledge and understanding in each of their subjects. The effort shown over the next two months will be reflected in End of Year Reports.

"Your HSC begins now" – the words uttered by Mrs McGregor at the HSC Information Evening. The Class of 2023's journey to the HSC began in 2018, and their Stage 6 pattern of study began at the start of 2022. But their HSC classes and courses have begun, and the students are equally excited and nervous.

With the role of being a Year 12 comes many privileges, but also sharpened responsibilities. The students received their Year 12 ties and read out the Year 12 pledge in front of the College community. Our new College captain then briefed the students about his take on the pledge and what the year group's response to having taken it means in their day-to-day life: "It's about the impression we give others, our character, our effort and our pride", Finn said. Words that apply to more than just HSC studies.

In week one, our prefects have also spoken to the group about Catholic Mission initiatives, including the Nature Zone Meetings. The boys were briefed about the importance of service hours, logging them and their appearance on their End of Prelim reports. They discussed Mental Health month and the need to "tune in and help create a world we can all tune into". They also celebrated merit high achievers, bronze award, and Prima Primum award recipients, and got an overview of the Term

ahead – with all eyes fixed on the highly anticipated Year 12 Retreat in Week 5.

It is a mandated night where the students and parents receive crucial information about NESA's requirements, processes pertaining to changing subjects, HSC/ATAR/ROSA eligibility, and the need to reflect on the results and learnings from the End of Prelim exams.

ENGLISH

Year 7 are currently learning about the Fantasy genre and studying how this is represented in JK Rowling's novel 'Harry Potter'. The key focus for this unit is to improve student writing, with explicit modelling and scaffolding used in the classroom to achieve this aim.

Year 8 are studying a range of short fiction stories and learning how to enrich their own imaginative writing with sensory imagery and figurative language. Year 9 have been learning about suspense in filmmaking through a study of Alfred Hitchcock, with a close focus on 'The Birds'. Later in the Term, they will be implementing what they have learnt to create their own suspense style short films.

As they approach their senior studies next year, Year 10 are learning about the power of allegory in storytelling through a comparative study of George Orwell's 'Animal Farm' and Neill Blomkamp's film 'Elysium'. Through this study, students can analyse the relationship between a composer's context and purpose, which is a key skill required for success in Senior English.

JAPANESE

Year 8

Students are now expected to read and write all the script of Hiragana confidently including variations and combinations. They explore vocabulary relevant to keeping in touch including transport, making



telephone calls, and finding common interests. They develop an understanding of features of Japanese school life and vocabulary associated with this topic. Later in the Term students learn about Christmas and New Year associations are explored for Catholic and Buddhist/Shintoist influences.

Year 9

Students consider the influence of religion on home life and associated Buddhist and Shinto superstitions. Students explore metalanguage used to describe unique attributes of Japanese such as verbs for



living & non-living things. Later in the Term they explore the experience of seasons in Japan and learn to describe weather. The topic also explores the natural phenomenon of Japan such as earthquakes and tsunami.

Year 10

Students continue to explore where to shop in Tokyo as well as shopping etiquette in Japan, such as taking off shoes in change rooms. In this Term we look at the experience of house swapping from



Japanese to Australian houses through the text types of letter, email, lists and descriptions. We also investigate World War II events that took place on Australian soil, such as the bombing of Darwin, the Cowra Outbreak, and the midget submarines in Sydney Harbour.

Towards the end of the Term, we explore **environmental issues** and the positive and negative effects humans have on their surroundings. The effect of Fukushima on local communities is investigated, and students consider how etiquette helps us share our environment with others. There is a focus on learning how to persuade others through language choice.

We look forward to another great Term of learning in Japanese!

All students will have a Yearly exam in Japanese to summarize their learning of the year in Weeks 5-7.

TECHNOLOGIES

We have a busy and engaging Term ahead in the Technologies KLA as we approach the end of the year.

Year 7 are developing their own coding projects to solve problems in technology mandatory. Some amazing creations are coming to life such as pyramid builders, Al enemy systems and more. Students are getting to experience what it's like to code and design solutions.

Year 8 Students are finalising their engineered systems unit. This unit has had them developing and racing Co2 cars. Students will get a chance to learn more engineering principles as the Term goes on.

Across the Technologies KLA, Years 9 and 10 will be engaging in a range of their selected subjects from iSTEM to Food Technology, Timber, Multimedia and IST. Students in timber are getting toward the end of their Ukulele and contemporary furniture projects. Students are learning about all the different finishes and accessories they can use to finalise their projects.

In IST students are continuing their software development unit. The students will extend their fundamental knowledge of coding, algorithms and data types.

HUMAN SOCIETY AND ITS ENVIRONMENT

Term 4 is shaping up to be a thoroughly interesting and rewarding Term for the boys in their HSIE subjects.

The Year 7 students in Geography are starting a unit on Place and Liveability, a topic is often considered a favourite by the boys as it focuses on the factors in our living spaces that impact our perception of liveability and how they can be improved.

Year 8 too are in for a fascinating time as they start exploring the different interconnections that exist in or global world. As is common in Geography, it's easy for the boys to find the topics highly relevant to their lives. That can be seen in this case as they explore interconnections forged through tourism and social media.

In Year 9 Geography, the focus will be on a topic called 'Changing Places'. This is a fascinating topic that looks at how settlement patterns and migration are moulding the world of today. The boys should find it personally relevant and thought provoking to consider their role in shaping Australia's urban future.

The boys in Year 10 Geography will finish up their focus on Human Wellbeing, a unit they started last Term. The end to this unit involves exploring the range of ways people and groups respond to inequality in terms of wellbeing and can be quite challenging when they consider their personal situation. It encourages them to consider how they can be involved in making a positive contribution to wellbeing for a sustainable future.

Along with Geography, the boys in Year 10 continue their study of Australian History. Last Term the focus was on the Civil Rights Movement in the US and now we move on to looking at how it influenced change in Australia. The boys will be introduced to the careers of key Indigenous Australian leaders from the past 50 years like Charles Perkins and Eddie Mabo and look at the importance of the contribution to the Civil Rights Movement.

After they have finished their investigation of Australia's economy, the boys in Commerce will dig into a topic that looks at the Commercial issues that surround travel. This too should be wonderfully relevant to the boys as they share their own travel experiences and prospects. They'll be challenged to think ethically and sustainably as they consider the importance of global citizenship.

SCIENCE

It's great to receive our students back at the College this Term to plan and conduct some important scientific investigations.

Year 10 students have begun to consider and brainstorm how an understanding of the Laws of Physics can help to improve their lives. They will investigate the Physics that underlies such concepts as heat, light, sound, gravity, and movement.

Year 9 Students are working scientifically to understand how multicellular organisms contain specialised cells and tissues that perform important functions. Microscopy is an important scientific tool for understanding the anatomy and physiology of living things. Students have already prepared wet mount slides of plant tissues to enable specimens to be observed and understood at the microscopic level.

Year 8 students are working scientifically to understand factors that are responsible for bushfires. Fuel load, fuel moisture, wind speed, ambient temperature, relative humidity, slope angle and ignition sources all play an important role that can often lead to threats to biodiversity, property, and human survival. An understanding of traditional indigenous fire management techniques combined with scientific insights will help our students to be responsible custodians of the Australian landscape.

Year 7 students returned to the college last week to further develop their skills in scientific inquiry. Working scientifically to understand the structural, physiological, and behavioural adaptations of earthworms is an interesting framework for posing questions, conducting research, forming and testing hypotheses, analysing data and drawing conclusions. It's also

an opportunity to consider the ethics of bringing animals into the laboratory for scientific investigation.
